Abstract Guidelines

Where applicable, abstracts should be structured around the following elements:

- **Introduction and Purpose**
- **Methodology**
- **Results**
- **Key Conclusions**
- **Practical Applications**

The Scientific Committee recognizes that some submission categories (e.g., workshops or theoretical contributions) may not follow this structure in full. Authors are therefore encouraged to adapt the format to the nature of their submission while ensuring that the objectives, content, and significance of the proposed presentation are clearly described.

Presentation Guidelines

Title Format

Please use sentence case for the title (i.e., capitalize only the first word and any proper nouns).

References

Given the word limit, authors are encouraged to avoid the use of references whenever possible. If references are included, all in-text citations must be accompanied by the corresponding references.

Author Information

Authors are responsible for ensuring that all author names, affiliations, and submission details are accurate at the time of submission. The corresponding author will serve as the primary contact for all communication with the Conference Secretariat.

Revisions After Submission

Please note that abstracts cannot be revised or amended after submission. Authors are therefore encouraged to review their submissions carefully before finalizing the submission process.



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Oral Presentations

Abstracts should consist of a single paragraph of **up to 300 words**, written in clear academic language, without references, and followed by **three to six keywords**.

If a submission has multiple authors, the **presenting author** must be identified at the time of submission.

Oral presentations will be grouped into **90-minute thematic sessions**, with each presentation allocated **15 minutes**, including time for discussion where applicable.

Standard audiovisual equipment for **PowerPoint presentations** will be provided. **Mac computers will not be available**. Authors requiring additional audiovisual equipment are kindly requested to indicate this during submission.

A confirmation email will be sent automatically upon successful submission of your abstract.

Please do not submit duplicate versions of the same abstract.

Poster Presentations

Posters should be prepared in **A0 portrait format**.

Detailed instructions regarding poster dimensions, mounting, and presentation procedures will be provided following acceptance of the abstract.

Symposia

Symposia consist of **three or four thematically related oral presentations** organized around a common topic and coordinated by a **symposium chair**, with a designated **discussant**.

Each individual presentation requires an abstract of **up to 300 words**, written as a single paragraph without references, and followed by **three to six keywords**.

For multi-authored presentations, the **presenting author** must be identified during submission.

The **symposium organizer** is responsible for submitting the complete symposium proposal, including:

- a general symposium abstract, and
- the abstracts of all individual presentations.

Each symposium will have a total duration of **90 minutes**.

The Scientific Committee reserves the right to adjust the duration or structure of accepted symposia, where necessary, to ensure the overall coherence and balance of the scientific programme.

Only **complete symposium proposals** will be considered for inclusion in the Conference programme.

Standard audiovisual equipment for **PowerPoint presentations** will be provided. **Mac computers will not be available**. Authors requiring additional audiovisual equipment are kindly requested to indicate this during submission.



Each workshop will have a duration of approximately **90 minutes**. The **maximum number of participants** should be specified by the workshop organizer at the time of submission.

The Scientific Committee reserves the right to recommend an alternative presentation format (e.g., oral presentation or poster presentation) for accepted submissions, where appropriate, based on the reviewers' recommendations and the overall requirements of the Conference programme.
